

Lifejackets

Manual: A basic lifejacket that you must deploy yourself with a simple pull on the inflation cord. Ideal on motor & speed boats where there is less danger of being knocked overboard.

Automatic: Still adopts the manual firing system but also has an automatic inflate system, which can be either a salt bobbin system that corrodes in water or a small firing cannister. Mainly used for coastal and leisure sailing.

Hammar: These are a hydrostatic firing mechanism that will only fire once immersed in water, usually beyond 10cm. Ideal for heavier weather and commercial uses.

Harness: Lifejackets come with or without an integral harness. The harness will provide you with a solid and secure fixing point for you to attach yourself to a safety line, jackline or fixing point onboard.

Lights: A lifejacket light is an essential item if you are sailing at night. They are generally water activated and will clip securely onto your lifejacket.

Re-arm Kits: We recommend that you service your lifejacket once a year. A re-arm kit will provide you with all the bite you need to service your lifejacket.
